




Our project uses recycled materials to combine artistry and environmental consciousness by creating a Baobab-inspired Christmas tree.

He has assured me that we can build a tree two storeys high!








So, Where does the school fit in? And why do we want to build it at school?




- Kids are the future planet protectors.
